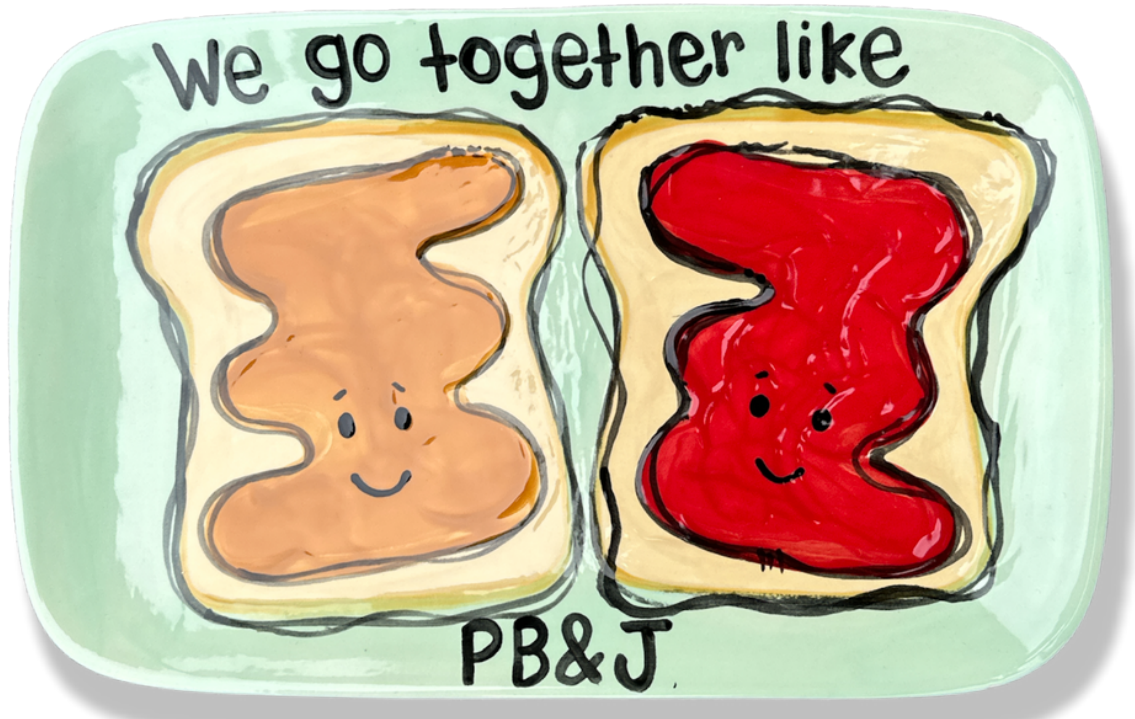

Simple Techniques - Stunning Effects

PB&J PLATE



MATERIALS

DB37467 Sqrve Dinner Plate
Liner Brush
Medium Brush
Pattern
Pen
Water Based Marker
NCR Paper or Tissue Paper

COLORS

CMM 14 - Gum Drop
CMM 25- Safari
CMM 98 - Red Head
CMM 72 - Sahara
CMM 31 - Licorice

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INSTRUCTIONS

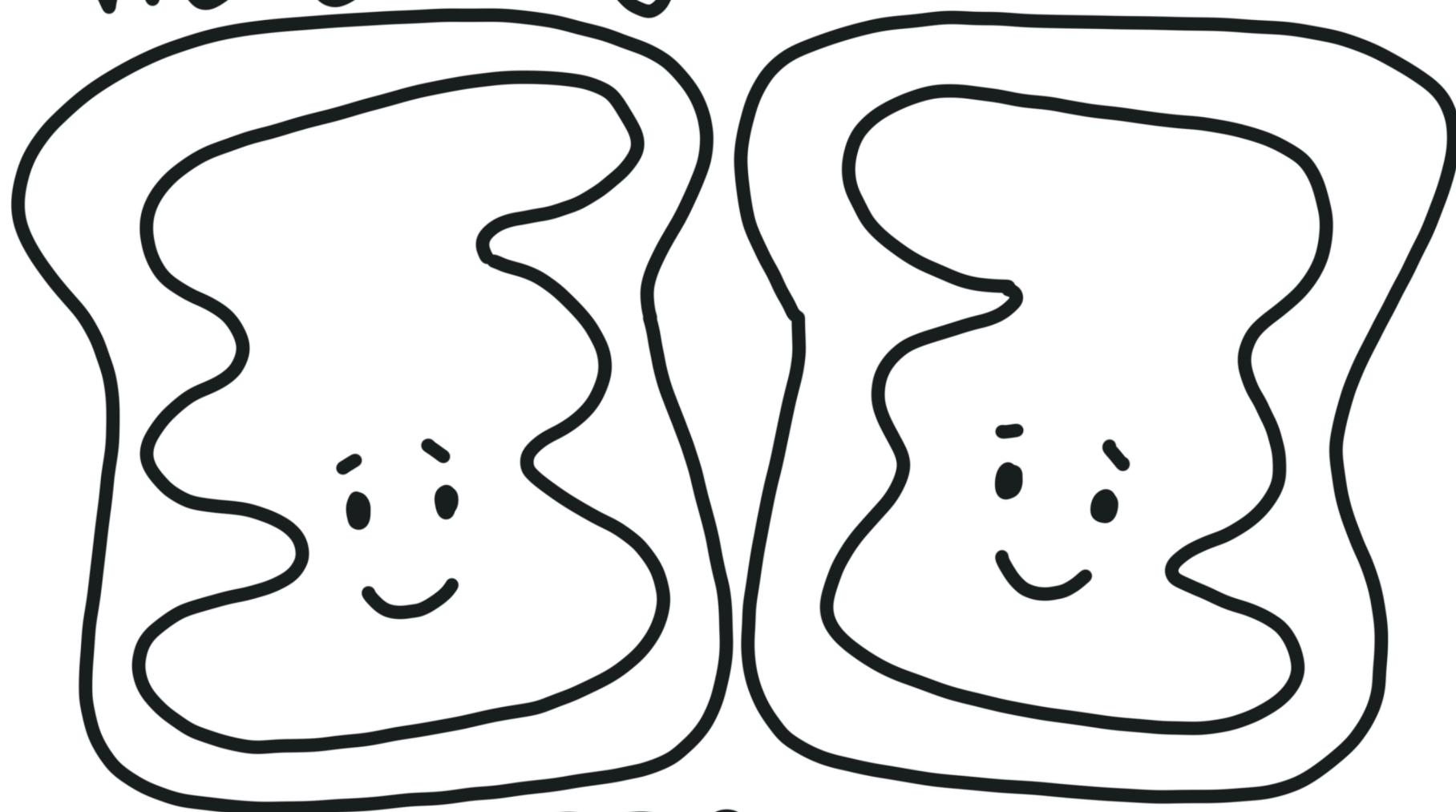
1. Start out by using the NCR paper and pattern to trace on the pieces of bread (we will use the words later).
2. Paint 3 coats of Gum Drop to the background of the plate.
3. Next, apply 3 coats of Sahara to the bread, working around where the peanut butter and jelly are going to be.
4. Use the line brush to make a heavy line around the bread with Safari. This represents the crust.
5. Paint on the peanut butter with 3 coats of Safari.
6. Then, paint on the jelly with 3 coats of Red Head.
7. Once the plate is dry, use the pattern to trace on the words to the label as well as the faces on the bread.
8. Apply 1 coat of Licorice to the words and face.
9. Finally water down the Licorice paint with 50% water to 50% paint. Outline the bread, the peanut butter, and the jelly. We purposely did a messy double outline to look sketched.

TIPS

- When using a liner brush, the harder you press on the brush the heavier the lines will be
- We intentionally did a messy double outline to look like sketches instead of hard lines.
